A Fire and a Gathering of Friends

During my childhood, I attended church camp every summer. At first camp was a place to meet new friends, swim in the lake and sleep in the woods. Year by year, however, camp became a place to explore my faith. I recall one evening gathered around our campfire: we sang together and the counselors told stories about their faith. I lay back and watched the fire's sparks rise on the warm air, lifting towards the twinkling stars, before dissipating. In that moment I felt a new sense of connection. The distant stars told of God beyond the universe, bigger than anything I could image, encompassing the night sky. But the campfire, our songs and our friendship told of God in our midst. Looking at the stars above me and the fire in front of me, I discovered a heavenly God who meets us here on earth. God became more than a distant deity; God became a living partner on my life's journey and my faith became a way of life.

For Jesus' first followers, the Church also began with a fire and a gathering of friends. Jesus promised the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples: God's continuing presence with them after he left. The Spirit would provide wisdom for their ministry and courage for their mission. Acts 2 describes a gathering of the disciples, which I imagine to be like our summer campfire: people sharing their stories, singing songs and praying together. In the midst of their gathering the Holy Spirit comes upon them, described as flames of fire resting upon each person. The disciples' experience is not of a distant God, but of One who sets their hearts, minds and souls on fire.

My campfire experience of God, like the disciples' Pentecost experience, happened with a group. Church begins when we recognize that our faith grows deeper in company than it grows alone. Our human interactions and our connections with one another both challenge and nurture our faith. Together we support each other while challenging one another to grow. Like the disciples, my early experience of God also included an image of flames. The Holy Spirit's fire evokes a sense of deep passion. As followers of Christ we commit to more than just a convenient faith; we open ourselves to the possibility of a passionate faith that sends us out in love and care. We prepare to be filled with the fire of the Holy Spirit.

The passionate flames of Pentecost, however, are not ours but God's. Pentecost really celebrates God's passion for us. God is not content to remain far away, distant or out of reach. Consumed with love for us, filled with passion and desire for our presence, God seeks us out. God comes into our midst, into our times of worship and our moments of prayer, into our sacred relationships and into the very heart of our lives. At Pentecost we do more than remember a single experience that happened centuries ago. At Pentecost we accept the daily promise that our heavenly God meets us here on earth.
